Parent Involvement Policy

Statement of Purpose

Farwell ISD is committed to the goal that each student will have the opportunity to enrich to the fullest his/her potential for mental, physical, social and emotional development in order that each student may grow in wisdom, stature, and in favor with God and Man. A positive link between the home and school will create the most conducive learning condition for each child. These open communication lines will expand and enhance learning opportunities for everyone involved.

The goal of parental involvement is to provide opportunities, training and information for parents that will help them assume a more meaningful role in improving student achievement and increase their effectiveness when participating in the planning, design, implementation and evaluation of school programs, i.e. Title I programs.

Title I and the Law

The purpose of Title I is to improve the programs of Farwell Elementary, Junior High and High School and to provide opportunities for children to acquire the knowledge and skills contained in the state content standards (Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills – TEKS) and to meet the state performance standards (State of Texas Assessments Academic Readiness STAAR).

The most recent law that affects Title I is the Every Student Succeeds Act. The goals of ESSA are as follows.

Goal 1: All students will reach high standards, at a minimum attaining proficiency or better in reading/language arts and mathematics.

Goal 2: All limited English proficient students will become proficient in English and reach high standards, at a minimum attaining proficiency or better in reading/language arts and mathematics.

Goal 3: All students will be taught by highly qualified teachers.

Goal 4: All students will be educated in learning environments that are safe, drug-free, and conducive to learning.

Goal 5: All students will graduate from high school.

Districts receiving Title I funds must implement programs, activities, and procedures for the involvement of parents in the Title I program. A written parental policy must be developed and agreed upon jointly by the parents. Parents of FISSD students will have the opportunity to view the policy on-line through the schools web page (www.farwellschools.org) or receive a hard copy when requested.

Parent Involvement in Developing the Policy

Parents, members of the community, and school staff will meet to discuss the design and implementation of the Parent Involvement Policy. FISSD will actively recruit participation through various avenues of publicity. Participation will hopefully include a diverse parent population. Meetings will be planned at convenient times and locations for all concerned parties. Parents and student needs will be assessed through questionnaires and parental suggestions as well as a variety of other measures targeted at creating a successful school environment.

Meetings for Title I Parents

FISSD will hold a fall and spring meeting for parents during the school year. Parents will be informed of new Title I guidelines and the variations from the previous year's program. The meeting will be held at a convenient time and location. Language translation and childcare will be provided to ensure parent participation and attendance. Written notices and media attention will all be directed at attracting as many parents as possible.

Parent Involvement Opportunities

The district will support many varied ways of parental involvement as it strives to develop and maintain an optimum learning environment for all students. At each campus, parents may contribute through volunteer programs at school as well as creating a supportive home atmosphere. The community may also participate through an array of activities that promote student success. District-wide activities include:

School Parent Compacts

In accordance with Title I regulations, each school must develop a parent-student compact with the parents of students participating in the program. This compact will enable the school and parents to share the responsibility for student performance and success. Members of the school's CIC will be consulted in the design and implementation of the compact. All parents will be given a copy of the compact detailing the responsibilities that teachers, parents, and students have in helping students accomplish their goals. Student's responsibilities will vary by grade level. Parent, Student and Teacher will sign the compact at the elementary and junior high level.

Staff/Parent Communication

Parents are welcomed through various avenues of communication throughout the school year. Newsletters, conferences, personal contacts and written notices will be utilized to establish and maintain an open line of communication. Staff members are encouraged to keep in close contact with parents not only in situations where there is an academic or behavior concern, but also when good things are going on in the classroom. Parents are encouraged to contact the school and/or their child's teachers if they have any questions or concerns about the instruction program.

Evaluation of Parent Involvement Program

The District and campus site-based committees will annually review and evaluate all aspects of the parent involvement program. Parents will be questioned about the effectiveness of the program and offer suggestions for improvement. The district will revise the Parent Involvement Policy based on the result of an annual review.
