Course Content Description

Throughout the first semester, this course introduced students to the foundations of World History and Geography. In the second semester, students will use prior knowledge of this introduction to study ancient civilizations and major world regions. Students will examine early civilizations to understand how geography-such as rivers, mountains, deserts and climate influenced settlement, agriculture, trade, and cultural development. Through the lens of exploration in social studies, students learn how migration, trade routes, and exploration led to cultural diffusion and the exchange of ideas, goods, languages, and beliefs.
